Gain an understanding of legal structure of juvenile justice in Kosovo2. Learn about the measures and sentences that can be cited on juveniles3. Be able to use remedies in juvenile criminal proceedings

<p>Juvenile Criminal Law will be introduced by applying lectures, discussions, group work, observing cases in prosecution and court, etc.</p> <p>During the lecture hours, interactive methods will be applied to enable students to participate regularly and actively in the classroom.</p> <p>Also during each lecture, power point slides will be prepared and materials from the case law will be analyzed, whereby all students will actively discuss debate or defending seminar papers.</p>
